Enfield Village Association Opens Information Office

Enfield, New Hampshire, September 14, 2010 – The Enfield Village Association (EVA) announced today that it is opening its office in the Copeland Building as an Information Office and welcomes visiting tourists, local business people, residents or anyone relocating to the area seeking information about Enfield and the surrounding areas. The official opening will be September 21st.

Executive Director, Dolores Struckhoff is excited to expand the services EVA provides.

Dolores stated that "since I was hired last year, I thought it would be important to provide an information service to the community through the EVA office. I look forward to sharing knowledge and advice on things to do in Enfield and the surrounding areas as well as keeping local businesses and residents informed of what services we provide.

She further stated: "Although there is an information kiosk across the street from the EVA office, it is not as personal and as valuable as direct contact. What a great way to learn about the needs of our visitors, businesses and residents as we plan for the future."

The office will stock local business and service (lodging, dining, cultural, public and recreational) materials.

Initially, the office will be opened on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays from 9 to 2 with plans to extend to Saturdays and Sundays with volunteer support from Noon to 4. EVA is also working with the State of New Hampshire, Department of Transportation to install a tourist related directional sign on Route 4 above High Street. It is EVA's hope to help direct traffic down Main Street to support local businesses during the Shaker Bridge closing.
